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# **Facilitator Notes**

### Part 1

**Call to prayer** (Spiritual Director)

**Shared Scripture and Prayer** (Spiritual Director)

Mark 10:35-45 Luke 9:57-62 John 15:8-9 and 16-17

### Call to reflection (Facilitator)

Think back to your first CRHP weekend, when you were an invitee. Remember the personal commitment you made to Jesus during the weekend. Perhaps you wanted to be different, to have a new life in Christ. Think about your life today...is it different? Did formation help you understand what you could do with that new life? We have to learn how to wear the new self we have put on.

I want to complement each of you on your faithfulness to the commitment you made to formation. You have given up time with your families, with your hobbies, just relaxation...you've put formation and Christ first. Thank you. And I hope you feel the grace that you've gained through this process. In Mark, Jesus says those who sacrifice for the sake of the gospel "will receive a hundred times more."

Tonight we're going to take some time to reflect on how you can continue to grow in your relationship with the Lord. Remember the commitment you made during Evening of Discipleship. And now you are being called to reaffirm that commitment to grow in your relationship with Christ in new ways.

Please take a few moments to write down ways in which you feel you still need/desire growth spiritually, and what would help you grow (Bible study, Scripture sharing, etc.) Be as specific as possible. We'll share these in a moment. (Give people 5-10 minutes to make some notes)

I'd also like you to reflect on your willingness to participate in the ministry of the parish.

In 1965, Pope Paul VI had these words about our shared responsibility for ministry. "In the Church there is a diversity of ministry but a oneness of mission. Christ conferred on the Apostles and their successors the duty of teaching, sanctifying, and ruling in His name and power. But the laity likewise share in the priestly, prophetic, and royal office of Christ and therefore have their own share in the mission of the whole people of God in the Church and in the world."

Christ renews His parish through all of your activities, ministries and calls that extend beyond the weekend. As we've learned through formation, we all have gifts and talents to share. For some, the weekend stretched our perceptions of those gifts. For others, it reinforced our talents. And we learned that when calls us to a ministry, He equips us to answer that call. But all ministries require formation.

Let's take some time now to reflect on where we've grown during our Christ Renews His Parish experience, what gifts and talents we've noticed more, and where we might feel called to grow or serve.

### **Closing comments**

The next step in this process is to pray about your call. The Ministry Guide that I'm handing out will help you focus your thinking. Pay special attention to the gifts God has given you. Some things that might help your reflection:

- Pray and listen
- Get information
- Talk with family
- Seek help in Scripture

Remember to think of both where to grow and where to serve...opportunities to deepen your spirituality as well as ways to volunteer. And be aware, God may be calling you to step back from ministries, to stay home with families for a while. Be open, listen attentively.

When we meet next, we'll pray and talk about your next step. You may be crystal clear about what you will do next to grow or serve. You may still need more discernment. Either is fine...discerning God's call is a lifelong process!

### Conclude with Phil. 2:1-16

Therefore if you have any encouragement from being united with Christ, if any comfort from his love, if any common sharing in the Spirit, if any tenderness and compassion, <sup>2</sup> then make my joy complete by being like-minded, having the same love, being one in spirit and of one mind. <sup>3</sup> Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, <sup>4</sup> not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others.

<sup>5</sup> In your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus:

did not consider equality with God something to be used to his own advantage;

by taking the very nature of a servant,

being made in human likeness.

<sup>8</sup> And being found in appearance as a man,

he humbled himself

by becoming obedient to death—

even death on a cross!

<sup>9</sup>Therefore God exalted him to the highest place

and gave him the name that is above every name,

<sup>10</sup> that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow,

in heaven and on earth and under the earth.

<sup>11</sup> and every tongue acknowledge that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

<sup>12</sup> Therefore, my dear friends, as you have always obeyed—not only in my presence, but now much more in my absence—continue to work out your salvation with fear and trembling, <sup>13</sup> for it is God who works in you to will and to act in order to fulfill his good purpose.

<sup>14</sup> Do everything without grumbling or arguing, <sup>15</sup> so that you may become blameless and pure, "children of God without fault in a warped and crooked generation." <sup>[c]</sup> Then you will shine among them like stars in the sky <sup>16</sup> as you hold firmly to the word of life. And then I will be able to boast on the day of Christ that I did not run or labor in vain.

Read John 8:12, repeat three times

A few remarks and silent reflection; ask to reflect on readings on Ministry Guide handout and responses to questions 8-11.

Invite shared prayer

Repose Blessed Sacrament and return to meeting room

### **Confirmation and Commissioning of Ministries** (Facilitator)

Read Acts 2:1-4 and 14-22

Each team member shares the Lord's call

New ministry

Confirmation of present ministry

If you don't hear a call, share that

We'll then affirm your gifts and pray a commissioning prayer...this is not an official acceptance of you into the ministry, but an affirmation of the direction you plan to take (school advisory, for instance)

After sharing, team members affirm the gifts of others; affirm choices of ministry or give honest feedback about calls

Repeat for each team member

Conclude with Here I Am Lord

### **Jesus' Pledge** (Continuation Committee)

Read John 17:6-10 and 15-19

Talk about parish availability to support ministry

Pledge to support them in pursuing their spiritual growth and ministerial aspirations

### **Sending Forth** (Spiritual Director)

Pick growth partners, pair up for mutual prayer support and encouragement, like ministries, prayer partners, whatever

Read Luke 10:1-9

Invite growth partners to leave two by two, visit chapel before going home

# **Building My Life on Christ**

(Option using Building My Life on Christ Handout)

    - Follow the daily readings
    - Lectio Divina
    - What is this passage telling my head, my heart and my hands?
- Most people that have success at maintaining a daily prayer time do it first thing in the morning.
  - Eucharistic Adoration (we are so blessed) Sign up for a regular time.
  - Attend XLT which is held on one Wednesday each month.
  - Regular reception of the sacraments especially Reconciliation
  - Mass/Eucharist Fully participate

- Have you identified a need that you would like to start a group to address?

  - Mentoring new team members with a similar role.

  - Volunteers in support of the weekend (food, HELP letters, chapel visits, filling in for emergencies, etc.)
  - Training invitations and kitchen coordinators to use website.

  - Organizing binders for each role to give new team members suggestions, contact names, suggested procedures

### SOME ADDITIONAL THOUGHTS:

- When we approach Christ we should remember to listen, find a quiet, prayerful space and sit in the classroom of silence and let God speak to you.
- Our call to pass our faith to our families and to the world is the most important work we will do
  in our lives.
- Are you in a position to fulfill the promise you made at the baptism of your children to be their "primary educator of the faith?"
- As adults we have an even greater responsibility to know our faith and to share it.
- Be prayerful about what you feel you are being called to take some time to discern.
- Take a step back to re-connect with your families. Find out what their needs are and how you can fulfill them.
- Do you need to start to pray and share spiritual things with your spouse in way that you have not done in the past?
- The Called and Gifted Program is an excellent start to discern your spiritual gifts and how you
  might use them to build the kingdom.
- Do you need an accountability group to stay on task (start one with your Christ Renews Team members).
- There are times that it is not clear what we are being called to. Exercise patience and surrender until it becomes clear. "All things were given to me from the moment when I no longer sought them." St. John of the Cross
- When prayer gets hard and you feel like giving up. Don't.
- We are not only called to accept God's will for our lives but to LOVE God's will. Be joyful

- We ask that between now and the next night of Pentecost that you spend some time reading over this handout, looking parish ministries and filling out the commitment sheet.
- Don't feel like you need to have all the answers, let the Holy Spirit lead you. Maybe your commitment is simply to explore a particular ministry or prayer activity. Maybe some of your legs are in better shape than others, start with one that is not so strong. That is a beautiful starting place. God honors the intent of our hearts.

### **Adult Faith Formation**

#### The Mission of Holy Trinity
